<u>You are responsible to Know all the camp rules.</u> Find them at the office and on our website. Office hours vary daily. Notices are posted so you can locate us within the camp. Cameras are placed as security and protection within the camp. Check In is anytime after 2pm and Check Out is 2pm. As a reminder, you are legally and financially responsible for your children, guests, and pets at all times.

- 1. Wear your wrist band. Everyone, including YOU is expected to wear a wristband; this is a visual safety and security feature we use at this camp. As a reminder, you are legally and financially responsible for your children, guests, and pets at all times
- 2. Guests are extra need wristband and car pass and are your responsibility. Please inform your guest of this before they get here. We have a guest fee they need to stop at the office before going to your site.
- 3. <u>Vehicle passes are required on all vehicles</u> entering our camp including <u>YOURS</u>, and your guests please inform them before they get here. Drive slow children playing everywhere.
- 4. <u>Noise and Quiet Times</u>, please respect your neighbors! While we try to encourage fun during the day please keep your joy at a respectable neighborly level, if you are too noisy for your neighbors you are too noisy! 11pm all radios, music, TVs off (if in your camper monitor so the volume cannot be heard outside of your camper). Conversations quieted. All kids including teens on campsites at 10pm. No kids on bikes after dark.
- 5. Respect camp site Boundaries. Please be aware of and also talk to your kids about the proper paths to use getting to and from the camp sites, restrooms, pool and park areas. Going thru others paid camp sites is not acceptable. RESPECT YOUR NEIGHBORS.
- 6. POOL SAFETY FIRST !!!

BEFORE ENTERING THE ENCLOSED FENCED AREA TO THE POOL ALL PERSONS SHOULD KNOW AND UNDERSTAND ALL POOL RULES. Parents please be sure your children understand all the rules and that you also understand the correct definition of supervising your children while they are in the pool. This helps the pool be a fun and safe place for everyone. This includes the use of the rest rooms provided for your convenience, please supervise your children.

Dept of Health regulations states: 13 AND YOUNGER NEED ADULT SUPERVISION AT ALL TIMES WHILE WITHIN THE FENCED AREA OF THE POOL. (Not a child older than 13 it must be an ADULT and please do watch your children, disruptive play in the pool is not allowed, have them follow the rules. This helps the pool be a fun and safe place for everyone) No pushing, shoving, running, diving. No pulling, or hanging on the basketball hoop.

BABIES AND TODDLERS must wear approved water pants no diapers or pull-ups.

NO FOOD OR BEVERAGES ALLOWED WITHIN THE FENCED AREA OF THE POOL. Please respect these guide lines. We have provided a covered picnic area with picnic tables and waste receptacles for your convenience when you want food and drinks at the pool. No glass allowed in the pool area. We are not your sitters you are all adults please follow the rules so others will also follow them. We don't like having to come and tell adults what you can and can't be doing and we do have signs but we don't like signs everywhere! Sings wreck the beauty and tranquil atmosphere of our pool. So please follow the pool rules. With our most gracious thank you.

- 7. KNOW WHERE AND WHAT YOUR CHILDREN ARE DOING. We love your kids but we are not your KID sitters, please be responsible and know where and what they are doing and inform them of areas of play and all areas that are Off limits, what's a toy and what's a garden. No playing on the stage, or in the rock gardens, the Mini Golf is pay to play; it is not part of the playground. Remind your kids not to run through other camp sites to get where they are going. No kids on bikes after dark. Our Camp has a natural environment, so be responsible and use good judgment: Wear proper foot covering, walk and play carefully, examine yourself for and use proper measures against insects. We have a river and several ponds be sure you know where theses are and talk to your kids about them.
- 8. **Restrooms** we are requesting your assistance with the supervision of your children in this area. Please remind your children that the camp restrooms are not play areas and hang outs. Remind them to flush toilets and turn off showers.
- 9. **Don't put hot grills on top of picnic tables** as you will notice it has warped the top of them! It wrecks them! We need the tables to make it for several more years please help us here thanks!!!
- 10. <u>Property destruction, of any kind will not be tolerated, by adults or children</u>. Included but limited too. Animals, camp buildings, equipment, plants, trees, playgrounds, recreation equipment, anything located in or property of the camp. No clothes line tied to our trees.
- 11. Offensive language, fighting, bullying will not be tolerated
- 12. No recreational motorized vehicles are allowed. Golf carts ONLY by permission from Camp Owner and is not to be used for recreation. Unfortunately they take away from the serenity of the camping experience for the other campers, and we have had many complaints and concerns arise from them being used in the camp.
- 14. <u>Pets by Permission only</u> Any violations of these rules can qualify for no longer being allowed to have a pet at your site and this will be enforced. Please be considerate of others with or without pets while also letting your 4 legged family members have an enjoyable camping experience.
 - **a.** At the camp site pets must be on a leash. <u>Do not tie them to our trees</u>. While not at the site must be on a leash and with adult supervision, unless discussed with us. For example: We have had too many small kids running thru the camp with the family dog having no control, and we are out there chasing down your family pet!!
 - b. No pets are to be left unattended overnight or for more than any 12hour time period.
 - c. Dogs are not allowed to dig holes,
 - d. Sites must be cleaned of pet litter and disposed of properly daily.
 - e. Barking must be kept under control and if its too much barking for your neighbors its too much.
 - **f.** Dogs must get along with your neighbors, present or new neighbors.
- 15. No fireworks. No fire arms or weapons.
- 16. No transporting of unapproved firewood is allowed in Minnesota. We have firewood available for sale at the office.
